## Default Judgment

Commissioner of the New Hampshire Banking Department ("Department") issued an Order to Show Cause against Respondent Karzman Credit Corp (d/b/a Classic Car Financial) ("Respondent Karzman"), Respondent George Lussier ("Respondent G. Lussier") and Respondent Stephen P. Lussier ("Respondent S. Lussier") on September 16, 2009 via U.S. Certified Mail Return Receipt requested. The Order to Show Cause was returned to the Department on September 22, 2009 and the Commissioner took service on October 12, 2009. The Respondents had thirty (30) days from October 12, 2009 to request a hearing or reach a settlement with the Department. Respondents failed to request a hearing or reach a settlement with the Department on or before November 11, 2009 (which is thirty days from October 12, 2009) as required to avoid Default.

It is hereby ORDERED, that:

 By operation of law, a default judgment was entered against Respondents on November 12, 2009;

1	2. The allegations contained in the September 16, 2009 Order to Show
2	Cause are hereby deemed true;
3	3. Respondent Karzman shall immediately pay to the Department an
4	administrative fine for a violation of RSA Chapter 397-A in the amount
5	of \$2,500.00;
6	4. Respondent G. Lussier shall immediately pay to the Department an
7	administrative fine for two (2) violations of RSA Chapter 397-A in the
8	amount of \$5,000.00;
9	5. Respondent S. Lussier shall immediately pay to the Department an
LO	administrative fine for two (2) violations of RSA Chapter 397-A in the
11	amount of \$5,000.00;
12	6. Respondent Karzman shall immediately pay to the Department the
L3	outstanding exam invoice totaling \$500.00;
L4	7. Each of the above named Respondents shall be jointly and severally
L5	liable; and
16	8. Respondent Karzman's license is hereby revoked.
