Topics include:


- How to calculate property losses for fires








REPORTING INCIDENTS FOR Q1/Q2/Q3

This is 1.7% of all 144,879 calls during the first, second, and third quarters of 2023. It represents 190 fire departments that submitted incident data during this timeframe.
